Welcome/Call to Order

• D. Ward called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m. CST

Roll Call

• A. Perry called roll; quorum was present (4/4 voting members)

Review and Adoption of the Agenda

- D. Ward reviewed the agenda and called for a motion to adopt the agenda.
- Motion:
 - $\circ~$ R. Causey-Upton motioned to adopt the agenda as presented.
 - M. Anthony seconded the motion.
 - All voted in favor; no one abstained; motion carried.

Review and Adoption of the Minutes

• D. Ward reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting and called for a motion to adopt them.

- Motion:
 - $\circ~$ D. Ward motioned that the committee adopt the minutes as presented.
 - R. Causey-Upton seconded the motion.
 - All voted in favor; 0 abstained; the motion carried.

Financial Sustainability Discussion (not a voting item)

- HRSA Grant NOFO should be published soon
 - o OTCC will review requirements to apply
 - OTCC may be eligible because it does work on behalf of state licensing boards
- Application fee for OTC
 - o Distinguish between licensing fee and OTC application fee
 - Suggestion that when OTC sets a fee it, plus the state fee (if applicable), combined should be less than the state licensing fee: OTC + State OTC Fee = < State Licensure Fee
 - There is a need to consider the impact that the OTC fee will have on state reciprocity fees
 - Licensing boards are funded through licensing/reciprocity fees; concern that OTC fees will decrease revenue
 - Fee needs to be reasonable but competitive
 - Even if the OTC fee is above the state licensure fee, the streamlined process to obtain privileges is marketable
- Follow up data needed to make informed fee setting decisions
 - PT Compact has records of PTC by state/year: N. Kalfas will request this information
 - States can analyze data to determine how many clinicians have home state v. out of state addresses to get an idea of who/how many might apply for OTC
 - NBCOT is conducting a survey to states about licensure fees; closes Feb. 14, 2024.
 - Finance Committee members would like to see the results at the 4.23.24 meeting
 - Finance Committee suggests putting the survey results on the ABM agenda
- Closing remarks
 - A fee is necessary to financially sustain the OTC/OTCC
 - A fee will not be implemented until the data system is built and is issuing privileges to practice
 - There is time to make this decision with the follow up data mentioned above
 - Be mindful of states' rulemaking processes needed to implement state fees
- Motion:
 - \circ Not a voting item
 - No Motion/No second
 - No votes captured

Financial Layers of Visibility

- A. Perry displayed a graph of the layers of visibility for OTCC's finances
- In the December 2023 meeting the authority to approve the process was delegated to Chair Ward
